
Dear Sir/Madam,

Suppliers Diversity

All of the following classifications are included and defined as Diverse Suppliers. All Suppliers shall provide a self-certification and/or current third 3rd party certification (required for HUBZone only) per the definitions below.

- Minority-Owned Business (MO) A minority-owned business (may be large or small) is defined as a business that is owned, managed and controlled 51% or more by one or more African Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Asian-Pacific Americans, and Asian-Indian Americans, or other ethnic minority.
- Woman-Owned Business (WO) A woman-owned business (may be large or small) is defined as a business that is owned, managed and controlled 51% or more by one or more women.
- Veteran-Owned Business (VO) A veteran-owned business (may be large or small) is defined as a business that is owned, managed and controlled 51% or more by one or more veterans.
- Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business (SDV) A service-disabled veteran-owned business (may be large or small) is defined as a business that is owned, managed and controlled 51% or more by one or more individuals with a service-connected disability.

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- **HUBZone Business (HZ) A** HUBZone business is defined as a business operating in a historically underutilized business zone where at least 35% of employees live within the HUBZone.
- **Small Disadvantaged Business (SDB)** A Small Disadvantaged Business is defined as a business that is owned, managed and controlled 51% or more by one or more individuals who are both socially and economically disadvantaged.
- **Disability-Owned Business Enterprise (DOBE)** A disability-owned business is defined as a business that is 51% owned, operated, managed, and controlled by a person(s) with a disability.
- LGBT-Owned Business Enterprise (LGBTO) A LGBT-owned business is defined as a business that is at least 51% owned, operated, managed, and controlled by an LGBT person or persons who are either U.S citizens or lawful permanent residents.
