1. Call to Order

The regular meeting of the Kings Creek Commerce Center (KCCC) Committee (Committee) of the Eastern Virginia Regional Industrial Facility Authority (EVRIFA) was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chair Mark Carter.

2. Public Comment

Chair Carter provided an opportunity for public comment. There were no comments.

3. Approval of Jan. 18, 2024 KCCC Committee Meeting Minutes

One correction on Paragraph Number 3, for Jim Noel's explanation to be completed.

4. Financial Report

Jim Noel provided an update on the financials for the KCCC and noted his appreciation as all Localities have paid. Mr. Noel noted there are no new expenses and only minor variations from budget.

5. Proposed TRC Engineers Support Contract

Jim Noel explained the need for KCCC Project engineering support to answer questions, serve as consulting experts on design issues, and to provide engineering drawings as needed (for example, when a prospective purchaser may need an exhibit). The maximum contract amount would be \$10,000.00 and there are adequate funds available.

Mr. Meade confirmed that this complies with the Virginia Public Procurement Act.
