




### **New Economic Order**

- Federal government creating first Defense Industrial Strategy
- AUKUS presents opportunity for inward and outward investment
- Work across organizations and municipal boundaries to implement

#### New Economic Development Model

- Create a Regional Investment Playbook to respond to new economic order
- Hyper focus on meaningful targets based on data-driven studies
- Utilize EVRIFA to encourage enhanced locality cooperation through revenue sharing

# What Created the New Economic Order? Who Wins?

**AUKUS:** A Trilateral security partnership between Australia, the United Kingdom, and the United States intended to "promote a free and open Indo-Pacific that is secure and stable."



### **AUKUS Presents an Opportunity**

- AUKUS Pillar 1 will provide Australia with conventionally armed nuclear-powered submarines
  - \$3 billion investment from Australian government into the US Supply Chain
  - Newport News Shipbuilding will hire an additional 21,000 people over the next 5 years
- AUKUS Pillar 2 will develop and provide advanced joint military capabilities to promote security and stability in the Indo-Pacific Region
  - Key target areas include:
    - Cyber capabilities
    - Artificial intelligence
    - Quantum technologies

- Undersea capabilities
- Hypersonic capabilities
- Electronic warfare capabilities
- Regional assets are perfectly positioned to assist, including:
  - Jefferson Lab High Performance Data Facility
  - NASA Langley Research Center & NIA
  - National Institute of Aerospace

- Virginia Tech Corporate Research Center
- ODU: VMASC, School of Cybersecurity
- HII & Lockheed Martin Centers of Excellence



### **Next Steps:**

## **Create A Regional Investment Playbook**

- Focus on targeted set of concrete projects that unlock economic possibilities.
  - Projects that have the potential to align with federal funding, leverage other public, private and civic capital, and drive inclusive and sustainable outcomes.
- Graduate Hampton Roads from a **region focused on the end assembly of sophisticated products** (e.g., nuclear powered submarines, offshore wind turbines) **to one that participates more extensively in technological innovation** and earlier parts of the supply chain.

He is a member of the board of directors of the Virginia Health Care Foundation.


