




### **KPMG Industrial Site Development Study**

- Alliance engaged Robert Boehringer of KPMG to analyze all large industrial sites in Hampton Roads
  - KPMG interviewed localities and property owners and narrowed the list down to six candidate sites
- Site Tours took place this week
  - KPMG team will adjust initial findings and prepare marketing materials for sites deemed high priority
- Studying regional development authorities to learn best practices for EVRIFA
- Next Steps:
  - Phase II: Review "unknown sites" (sites not currently on the market) that may have high potential for investment
  - Phase III: Analyze the Coastal Virginia Commerce Park (Williams Farm) and how to position it as a premier megasite



### **Data Center Recruitment Strategy**

- Study completed by Mike Grella (formerly of Amazon) on the potential of data center development in Hampton Roads
  - Discussed reasons why Hampton Roads is poised for growth
    - Virginia's status at the internet's main hub
    - Subsea cables in Virginia Beach
    - Investments by Cox and others; establishment of regional fiber ring
  - Ranked sites that are ideally suited for such development
- New: Jefferson Lab awarded "High Performance Data Facility"
  - Fastest supercomputer in the world
  - Will attract heavy data users







## Eastern Virginia Regional Industrial Facility Authority (EVRIFA)

Localities can co-invest in projects and share in the revenue.

#### **History of EVRIFA:**

- 2018 Founded by the Peninsula communities
- 2021 Acquired on first property in York County
- 2022 The Alliance took over as the managing agency
- November 14, 2023 Virginia Beach voted to join the EVRIFA

## Kings Creek Commerce Center

- EVRIFA's first project: 432 acres of surplus state property in York County
- Funding for property acquisition secured by leasing 250 acres for a 20MW solar project
- Secured GO Virginia grant for site preparedness engineering work that is underway
  - Alta Survey
  - Geotechnical investigation
  - Master planning potential site layout and utilities
- Ranked as one of KPMG's candidate sites


## **Nneka Chiazor Market Vice President, Cox**

Nneka Chiazor serves as Cox's Market Vice President for Hampton Roads.
